



Military History Group

- We are a small group (often 12-18 people at each meeting) that meets once a month, on the second Friday of each month, at 10.00am in the Dolphin Pub in Bartholomew Street, Newbury.
- The meetings last for two hours during which we normally have a couple of talks by members of the group on subjects of their interest plus a few unusual photos or objects that people send in.
- The group is a mixture of ex-military and enthusiasts with a wide and eclectic range of interests.
- Recent meetings have ranged across:
 - European Wars of the Nineteenth Century
 - Individual generals/leaders e.g. Pyrrhus
 - Campaigns such as the Rhine Crossings in 1945
 - Technology for example the development of aircraft between 1903 and 1919
 - Local history such as the Pillboxes of Sulham Valley
 - Family military history and members' own military service
- Occasionally we have external speakers, recently one on Operation Jedburgh during WW2, and arrange informal trips to local museums
